


# El Salvador

## POST DATA


- El Salvador Volunteers reported 7 victimizations in 2014.
- The most commonly reported crime classification by El Salvador Volunteers is theft.
- The most common serious crime classification reported by El Salvador Volunteers is robbery.
- 99% of all reported victimizations resulted in no physical injury to the Volunteer.
- 77.3% of all reported victimizations occurred outside of the Volunteer's assigned site.
- 40.2% of all reported victimizations occurred on public transportation, most often on buses.
- 24.7% of all reported victimizations occurred in a capital city.
- 72.2% of Volunteer reported victims were female and 27.8% were male.

**Incidence Rate of Reported Victimizations, El Salvador, IAP Region, and Peace Corps Global, 2014**


