


# Sierra Leone

## POST DATA


- Sierra Leone Volunteers reported 24 victimizations in 2014.
- The most commonly reported crime classification by Sierra Leone Volunteers is theft.
- The most common serious crime classification reported by Sierra Leone Volunteers is robbery.
- 97.9% of all reported victimizations resulted in no physical injury to the Volunteer.
- 51.7% of all reported victimizations occurred outside of the Volunteer's assigned site.
- 37.9% of all reported victimizations occurred in a Volunteer residence.
- 26.9% of all reported victimizations occurred in a capital city.
- 55.9% of Volunteer reported victims were female and 44.1% were male.

**Incidence Rate of Reported Victimization, Sierra Leone, Africa Region, and Peace Corps Global, 2014**


