Peace Corps and Fortune 500s: Skills that Pay the Bills By Richard Campbell RPCV/Mali 94-96



What appeal does an RPCV hold for the Fortune 500 Companies of America looking to expand their corporate ranks? The answer is simple: proven leadership and problem-solving skills.

Just consider the basic work profile of a PCV and the skills associated with their work at site:

1) PCVs are generally at their site or work location typically by themselves: *time management*

2) PCVs often raise their own funds to support projects: *development and budgeting*

3) PCVs must earn the trust and respect of the members of their community: *team building*

4) PCVs face and overcome complex challenges: *problem solving and critical thinking*

5) PCVs identify community stakeholders and mobilize them to achieve common goal(s): *recruiting and consensus cultivation*

Keep in mind that this is only a very generic list of

skills adopted by PCVs at their sites, since as no PCV has the same experience as another, each PCV cultivates a unique set of skills. Suffice to say, PCVs who complete their tour of service have a lot to offer to potential employers.

Let's examine more closely this short list. As you reflect back about your time as a PCV, it is important to note that the skills you used as a volunteer abroad closely mirror those employed by your typical middle manager at many private sector companies. For example, if you are at your site by yourself, you are a manager by default as you represent the company—Peace Corps. Consequently, as a representative, it is incumbent upon you to build your project and complete the job.

Furthermore, any PCV who has raised funds to get a project off the ground has utilized project-planning, project management, budgeting, proposal-writing, account-reconciliation, and logistical-planning skills. You may have

conducted purchases, paid vendors, and maintained records. These are similar to the basic duties of a CFO or accountant in any organization. These competencies are not only transferable, but are also highly marketable to employers.

You likely discovered at site that teamwork is essential. Without a team unit at your site, you may have found that projects are difficult to get off the ground. PCVs have to identify the best candidates for a team, build rapport among team members and your host country counterpart (ie the client), inspire them to execute and deliver results, while simultaneously maintaining a leadership position throughout the duration of the project. All of these skills are the basic functions utilized by recruiting and human resource management specialists in a company.

As with all projects, challenges and unforeseen road blocks can occur; this is an unavoidable fact. These unpredictable events can take

different forms, including: weather, challenging working situations, sickness, delays, and a host of other challenges which can slow a project down. Mistakes will be made, but how you handle these challenges (and possibly discover new ways to overcome future challenges) will speak to your flexibility and adaptability as a leader. In the private sector, such leadership management issues are what managers confront when dealing with

setbacks and figuring out new ways of overcoming challenges. Problem-solving skills learned onsite are invaluable tools when working through corporate life's tougher times.

At the end of your service as a Peace Corps volunteer, you will have accumulated a variety of transferrable competencies that will help you excel in most all job sectors. Whether in the private, public or non-profit sectors, the skills

you learned while at your site will take you far in your career. You have acquired the necessary skills and now is the time to move forward and reap the rewards of your hard work.

Response Volunteer with engineering background needed in Guyana

An Environmental Waste Engineer is needed to work with a local NGO that is constructing a plastic bottle school for out-of-school youth and adults interested in working with the environment, management, fisheries, and wildlife. The Environmental Waste Engineer will coordinate and secure materials for site construction and will work with partnering companies to develop a core curriculum and schedule for environmental and sustainability education while collaborating with the local district board to educate the people of the North Rupununi community in sustainable solid waste management practices.

Animal/goat husbandry experience needed in the Philippines.

A Livelihood Agricultural Specialist is needed to work with Bahay Tuluyan, a local NGO that provides protection and empowerment programs to street children. To lessen its reliance on international funding agencies, Bahay Tuluyan developed a fundraising plan that includes a variety of self-reliance programs including raising goats and producing dairy products. A PCRV is needed to help the NGO develop a functional system for running the goat farm while working side-by-side with staff and children to develop and implement a milk processing system and training manual.

TEFL Teacher Trainer needed in Romania.

A TEFL Teacher Trainer with at least five years of progressive classroom teaching experience will work with the Ministry of Education and the Teacher Training house in Romania to ensure that all current and future Romanian English teachers are properly trained in the newly established national curriculum standards. The PCRV will help create, pilot, and test new teacher training models to fulfill the new curriculum requirements. The PCRV will be responsible for performing a training needs assessment, designing a teacher training curriculum, monitoring and evaluating the curriculum, and compiling reports on the findings.

Youth trainer with intermediate-level chess experience needed in Saint Lucia.

A Youth Trainer is needed to help the National Community Foundation (NCF) engage young people in positive activities to promote healthy lifestyles and social interaction skills. The Youth Trainer will design at least three youth leadership and life skills trainings that are catered to specific community needs, including the design and facilitation of at least five arts-based activities, environmental projects, or outdoor education and sporting activities among area youth. The PCRV will also start 10 community chess programs and conduct 24 chess training sessions for teachers and community facilitators.

Experience with HIV/AIDS prevention programs needed in South Africa.

Two Organizational Development Specialists are needed to work with two NGOs aiming to combat AIDS, tuberculosis, and other communicable diseases in their communities through increased outreach, education, and access to healthcare services. The PCRV will build the capacity of key teams within each organization to improve growth and strategic plans as well as policy development. The Volunteers will also empower the training teams to develop effective training materials, improve presentation and course development skills, and strengthen their HIV/AIDS education and awareness training programs for youth. Finally, the PCRVs will train the finance teams on proposal writing and strategies for improving fundraising.
