## An Enduring Legacy

*“It is well to be prepared for life as it is, but it is better to be prepared to make life better than it is.”*

Sargent Shriver

As we commemorate the Peace Corps on its 51<sup>st</sup> Anniversary, we must appreciate the breadth of human betterment that it has so prominently left in its wake. There are few organizations that have such far reaching and long-lasting effects as that of the Peace Corps. Its message and accomplishments resonate profoundly in both the American Volunteers and the citizens of host countries in which Volunteers serve; truly making the world a better place. A Volunteer’s service abroad may end, but their commitment to peace will endure through the Peace Corps’ Third Goal.

The Peace Corps was launched fervidly and with great alacrity in 1960. Presidential candidate John F. Kennedy proposed to a roaring youth audience at the

University of Michigan a federal program that would send Americans to work in underdeveloped countries. The students loved the idea, and loved him for having it. Kennedy made it into office and kept his promise signing Executive Order 10924 on March 1, 1961, establishing the Peace Corps.

Sargent Shriver, the first Director of the Peace Corps, received over 10,000 applications within the initial few months of the organization’s existence, demonstrating the American commitment to world peace. The first batch of Volunteers set-out for Tanzania and Ghana that same year and set the Peace Corps off to a running start. Over 50 years later, the commitment and passion exhibited by those first batches of Volunteers has not flagged, as Volunteers continue to uphold the legacy of the Peace Corps by serving in 76 countries.

The architects of this organization envisioned one thing: Peace. President Ken-

nedy decided that in a multifarious world of constant change and volatility, it was imperative that the American government create an organization exclusively concerned with world friendship. There are three pillars needed to secure this ideal: First and foremost, the mission of the Peace Corps is to help the people of interested countries in meeting their need for trained men and women. The second action step is to promote a better understanding of Americans on the part of the people served. Finally, the third goal at the Peace Corps is to promote a better understanding of other peoples on the part of the Americans.

The Third Goal, “bringing it home to America” is, to a large extent, left entirely up to the discretion of Returned Peace Corps Volunteers (RPCVs) discretion. Because each Peace Corps experience is personal, unique, and new, the lessons from each tour abroad
