Top 10 Questions RPCVs Ask the RVS Program Support Assistant

In my role as the Program Support Assistant for Returned Volunteer Services, I answer a wide variety of RPCV questions. Because a lot of the questions I am asked keep coming up, I wanted to share answers to the top ten questions people ask me.

10. Can you help me meet fellow RPCVs in Scranton, PA? Can you help me find someone I served with?

Due to limited resources and restraints placed on the government due to the Privacy Act, Returned Volunteer Services cannot give you the contact information for RPCVs.

However, there are many RPCV groups all around the country, and the National Peace Corps Association (NPCA) has information for many of these groups. NPCA is a nonprofit group separate from Peace Corps, the federal agency. NPCA maintains a free social networking site to help you connect with other RPCVs. Visit www.peacecorpsconnect.org for more information.

9. I need a reference. Can you please act as a reference for me?

Peace Corps staff members cannot serve as references for returned Volunteers they do not

know. If you need to prove to a prospective employer that you were a Peace Corps Volunteer, you may request a Certification of Service by emailing certifications@peacecorps.gov. The auto-reply you receive will have a form attached, which you should fill out and return to same email address. **Please note:** It takes seven to 10 business days to receive a certification.

However, if an employer is looking for a professional reference, Peace Corps headquarters is not a good choice. We only have the general information that appears on your Description of Service, and most likely an employer is looking to connect with someone who can speak to your strengths, work ethic, interpersonal skills, judgment, etc.

If you are still in contact with your post, ask your APCD or DPT (PTO) to act as a reference. If you aren't in contact with them, or if they no longer work for Peace Corps, you might have to get a bit more creative. You can try to reconnect with them using services such as LinkedIn or Facebook. Perhaps you can even find them through NPCA's site (www.peacecorpsconnect.org). You should also consider other people

who can act as a good reference: perhaps you can ask your PCVC or PCVL, your site-mate, or another Volunteer who worked with you on a project. You might even want to list your HCN counterpart or coordinator, if they speak English and have a reliable means of contact. No matter who you select, you should make sure they will give you a glowing recommendation.

8. Can you help me get a record of the immunizations I received during my Peace Corps service?

Peace Corps' Office of Medical Services, Post Service Unit, can help you get copies of your immunization records. Email to psu@peacecorps.gov or call 202.692.1553.

Keep in mind that many vaccines have limited lifetimes. So you might need boosters from some of the vaccinations you received during service if you served 30 years ago. For more information, visit the CDC website at www.cdc.gov or ask your health care provider.

7. How can I make sure Peace Corps has my new address?

Fill out the form at www.peacecorps.gov/rpcv/info. It allows you to update your email address, phone number, and even

Arts Education Pilot Program in Benin

Calling all artists and musicians!

Peace Corps Response Volunteers are needed to build the capacity of teachers at the International Center for Art and Music in Ouidah, Benin, to develop and implement an experimental arts and music education curriculum. The school focuses on using art and music to expand the cognitive thinking skills of its 280 primary school students. Research has shown that music and art education stimulates critical thinking skills and enhances academic performance in other subjects such as math, science, and language arts. There is a great need to develop local teachers' capacity to effectively integrate music and art into their daily teaching.

The PCRV will offer lessons and courses to secondary students and adults in art and art history. An [Arts Curriculum Development Specialist](#) is needed to create an experimental arts curriculum and train teachers to implement the new curriculum with their students. The curriculum will promote the development of creativity and cognitive thinking skills among students. The PCRV will also provide arts education training to 40 local primary school teachers at 20 area schools.

A [Music Teacher](#) is needed to develop a music and performing arts curriculum to improve the critical and cognitive thinking skills of primary school students. The PCRV will direct chorales and conduct lessons and courses to primary and secondary school students in his or her specialty (such as piano, guitar, etc). The Volunteer will also offer continuing education opportunities for area musicians and performers.

Math and Science Teachers needed in Uganda!

Multiple [Teacher Trainers](#) are needed to provide training for university instructors in teaching mathematics and science courses and integrating HIV/AIDS components into course curricula. The PCRVs will introduce effective and innovative pedagogical approaches to the teaching of science and math. Tips from the Certification Specialist

If you have become a federal employee after service, why should you make the deposit to "buy back" service credit towards retirement? To receive a monthly annuity from the federal government, you must be vested in a retirement system. Being vested in Federal Employees Retirement System (FERS) or the Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS) requires five years of creditable civilian service. If you served for 2 years (training time is not included), then you can "buy back" credit for those 2 years of service to couple with your time as a federal employee to help meet the 5 year vesting requirement. For example, Peace Corps staff positions are limited to 30-month tours, so having your volunteer service credited toward retirement frequently adds enough time to meet the vesting requirement. Please allow 7-10 business days to process your Certification request.

6. I don't have a ton of money to spend on the job search. How much does it cost to attend a Returned Volunteer Services career event?

Returned Volunteer Services offers a variety of career support, including career events and access to third-party job bulletins. All of our services to RPCVs are FREE OF CHARGE. Our most popular service is the series of career events we offer. We hope you will be able to join us at one of our semi-annual national

Our career events are open to all RPCVs; however, they focus on the initial transition home from Peace Corps. Therefore, RPCVs that have been back two or less years are especially encouraged to attend.

Unfortunately, though the events are free of charge, we do not have resources to provide RPCVs with lodging, transportation, or meals.

5. I am completely lost. What am I supposed to do now?

There is no simple answer to this question.

Peace Corps is a life-defining experience. When you leave your country of service, you lose a sense of community and identity. It can be traumatizing. Returned Volunteer Services gets that. I get that. You aren't alone!

Though you have lost, in some sense, the community and identity you had as a PCV, you are gaining a new community, the RPCV community. We encourage you to take advantage of that community by accessing our resources, including the RPCV mentoring program (managed by NPCA in conjunction with the Peace Corps). The program connects recently returned Volunteers with RPCVs who have already successfully made the transition.

RVS career events are another way to tap into the RPCV community; in fact, we have received feedback that one of the most powerful aspects of our events is the support participants receive from their fellow RPCVs. So if you are looking for support, especially in the career-search aspect, see question #6 for more details on how to attend one of our events.

As you embark on that self-guided search for the "next," we encourage you to conduct some self-assessment. We offer a package of self-assessment software by Focus Careers. This tool asks questions about your education, skills, strengths, hobbies, likes, and dislikes and suggests career fields for you to look further into.

Focus Careers isn't like the quizzes you took in high school. It doesn't tell you what you should be; instead, it provides you with information regarding different career paths. It tells you what the work day would be like, what the educational requirements are, and provides you with estimated salary ranges.

4. Was I federal employee? What was my pay scale and grade level?

As a Peace Corps Volunteer, you were not a federal employee and therefore do not have a pay scale, rank, or grade. This means you also did not have a GS-level. You can still apply to federal jobs, but you'll need to assess your qualifications and experience. Recent RPCVs generally qualify at the GS-7 or 9 levels, depending on their combinations of experience and education. Visit www.usajobs.gov/EI27.asp for more information.

Since you were not a federal employee, you do not have "reinstatement eligibility" and you never had an SF-50. An SF-50 is a document issued to federal employees that includes information about their grade level and job performance. If a federal employer asks you for an SF-50, you should supply them with a copy of your Description of Service. (If you've lost your DOS, you may request

another copy by emailing certifications@peacecorps.gov; see question #9 above.) Also, as a PCV, you did not have a security clearance. The background investigation you completed when you applied to Peace Corps was simply a suitability check.

However, if you do subsequently work for the federal government, you can buy back your Peace Corps service to use toward federal retirement benefits. See http://www.peacecorps.gov/index.cfm?shell=resources_returned.benefits.fedretire for more information.

3. I want to do Third Goal presentations, but it feels like I am talking to a brick wall! How do I connect with my audience?

I think every RPCV has felt the sting of the "eyes glazed over" look. I know my family and friends are sick of "Well, in Suriname..." stories.

Have you tried speaking in classrooms? Children are endlessly interested in the outside world. For many students this will be one of their only opportunities to experience a foreign culture.

The best way to connect with a classroom is to ask! If you know a teacher, ask them if they would be interested in having you speak about your country of service. If you have cousins, nieces, nephews, or friends who have children, ask them to help you connect to a teacher. Call up community groups, Girl Scouts, churches, or even the colleagues of your parents and friends. And what about the teachers you had growing up yourself?

You can also sign up for the Speakers Match Program through World Wise Schools, which matches teachers in the U.S. with local RPCVs willing to come to their schools to give presentations. To sign up go to www.peacecorps.gov/wws/speakersmatch.

When you have a Third Goal event scheduled, send an email to engage@peacecorps.gov and tell us about it so we can send you some stickers and bookmarks to distribute in your presentation.

2. Can I use my Peace Corps passport for personal travel?

No. If you don't already have one, you must get a personal passport for personal travel. Your Peace Corps passport is a government-issued passport and should only be used for official travel. You can travel on your Peace Corps passport for up to 90 days after you close your service. However, once you arrive in the United States, you may not use your Peace Corps passport - you should return it to Peace Corps to be canceled. Please return it to Peace Corps, Attn: Sato, 1111 20th St. NW, Washington, DC 20526 (phone 800.424.8580,

ext. 1170, in case of questions). If you want to keep your passport for sentimental reasons, please send a note with your passport to the above address requesting that once the passport is deactivated, you would like it sent back to you. Return postage is not necessary **And the number one question RPCVs ask the Program Support Assistant is, "What is noncompetitive eligibility?"**

Noncompetitive eligibility (NCE) is a special federal government hiring mechanism, which allows certain individuals to be hired regardless of whether they are the most qualified candidate for the position.

When federal government agencies in the competitive service have a vacancy, they post a position on USAJobs.gov (or similar website), collect and assess applications, then invite the best-qualified candidates to interview. This is a very time-consuming process. And sometimes, the most qualified person is not the best fit for the position. Noncompetitive eligibility gives federal employers a great deal of discretion in the hiring process, and allows them to bring on talented and qualified RPCVs quickly.

Now, as I said, this is my number one question. And it is typically followed up with, "How do I use my NCE?"

You can search for "status candidate" positions on USAJobs.gov, by clicking on the "advanced search" button. You can also network with federal hiring managers, or you can respond to a call for NCE resumes on the RPCVNetwork listserv. The RPCVNetwork is a Google group moderated by Returned Volunteer Services exclusive to RPCVs. It often includes announcements from federal hiring managers wishing to fill positions using NCE. You can apply for membership to RPCVNetwork by visiting <http://groups.google.com/group/rpcvnetwork> and following the directions. Please be sure to include your name, country of service, and the years you served in your request. We suggest choosing the "Digest Email" option to limit the number of emails you receive from the listserv.
