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Peace Corps Fellows/USA Program Emphasizes Service Learning

You have a bachelor's degree and 27 months of career-building international experience under your belt. Now what? Are you still feeling the call to give more to a community in need?

If so, it's important to remember that, as an RPCV, you have lifetime eligibility for the Peace Corps Fellows/USA graduate school program. Through Fellows/USA, you can receive university credit, graduate assistantships, or even tuition remission to carry out the type of work you love most—work in community.

"We're delighted with the way our Fellows/USA program has evolved over the past 25 years," says Julie Driver, manager of Fellows/USA for Peace Corps. "We've built a robust system of graduate school options for RPCVs. Fellows can work with migrant Latino communities in Ohio, they can teach at inner-city schools in New York, or they can help with housing and community development in New Orleans."

All the while, Fellows can be working toward their master's or even doctoral degrees. Participating Fellows/USA universities belong to a strong tradition of integrating community service into the academic experience. Fully 29 of the 52 Fellows/USA universities were named this year on the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll. Of these 29 universities, four schools were named to the Honor Roll with Distinction: the University of Michigan, Fordham University, Duquesne University and the University of Pennsylvania. Launched in 2006, the Honor Roll's Presidential Award is the highest federal recognition an institution can receive for its commitment to service learning and civic engagement.

For many Fellows/USA alumni, the program has served as a rite of passage into their post-graduate careers. Randy McGinnis, a student from the first cohort of Fellows to enroll at Teachers College, Columbia University

in 1985, credits his experiences as a student teacher in the Bronx for his authenticity as an educator. Now a professor of Science Education at the University of Maryland-College Park, McGinnis says, "The fellowship program launched me into my career in higher education. I think it made me a unique researcher in higher education. People know me as authentic... being able to teach. I've been able to take on unique leadership roles."

Another Fellow from the first cohort, Andrea Turkalo, now researches elephants in the Central African Republic. Having received recognition for her cutting-edge work on such national platforms as *60 Minutes* and *National Public Radio*, Turkalo nonetheless looks back to her Fellows/USA experience, together with her Peace Corps service, as the most significant points in her career. She says, "Peace Corps and teaching in the South Bronx while working on my master's at Teachers College are the highlights of my







life. They were both intense and they have left me with the most vivid memories of people and places. They also prepared me for what lay ahead....”

More recent Fellows also find that the rigorous combination of academic studies and service learning makes a wonderful building block in a successful career. Amanda Kucich served as a Volunteer in Samoa from 2003 to 2005 and then followed up on her Peace Corps experience with a fellowship in public administration at the University of Arizona. As part of the fellowship, she worked for the United Way of Tucson and Southern Arizona where she subsequently found a full-time job overseeing youth develop-

ment. She says, quite simply, “I definitely would not be in this position without the Peace Corps Fellows/USA program.”

From its first baby steps with Teachers College 25 years ago, Fellows/USA has grown into a large and varied set of partnerships with 52 universities in 27 states and the District of Columbia. Fellows can concentrate in academic areas ranging from international education to regional planning, public health, or even creative writing. They can attend a small university such as Johns Hopkins University, or a large school such as the University of Michigan.

“After two-and-a-half decades of growth for this initiative,” says Driver,

“there are really so many options on the table for RPCVs today. If an RPCV wants to get an MBA, we have programs for them. If someone is interested in environmental studies, that’s an option, too.” The common strand that ties all of these programs together, emphasizes Driver, is the community service. “At heart, we are a Peace Corps program, and we celebrate the Peace Corps commitment to volunteerism.”


