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Peace Corps Response

Third Goal is a Charm

By Sandra Annette Rogers (RPCV Honduras 1985–87)



The Peace Corps has remained on my mind now for 20 years. Like the memory of my first freshly-made thick corn tortilla that I ate with crude salt or the first taste of a green mango with hot sauce, lime, and (more) salt, my Peace Corps experience remains vivid! Looking back, I realize that I have been involved in various Third Goal activities both formally and informally since my volunteer service in Honduras from 1985 to '87. You never stop being a Peace Corps Volunteer!

My first Third Goal activity took place while I was still serving in Honduras. I submitted a quilt to the Peace Corps' Atlanta office to be displayed during the 25th anniversary of the Peace Corps. The quilt was designed as a flag, with each stripe an arm, reaching out to help someone. The arms got progressively shorter as the "collaboration" was made with the receiver, and the last arm "shook" the hand of the recipient. The design signified

the contrast between agencies' past efforts of distribution of goods and services, and the Peace Corps' effort of working with host country nationals to bring about change.

When I returned home from service, I asked that my family hold a reunion. It was a great way for me to share my experience and give them all the gifts that I had brought back. And although I didn't realize it at the time, I influenced one of my nieces to join the Peace Corps: Rachel (Rogers) Miller served in Lesotho from 1999 to 2000. You really never know who you might persuade to serve, even at informal gatherings. In my case, I returned in 1987 and my niece volunteered 12 years later.

I drew on my experience again while pursuing my Master's in teaching. I wrote a poem about my Honduran neighbor and used it as part of a dance and spoken-word performance I choreographed for the theater department. If my Honduran neighbor only

knew the profound impact she had on me with her small-framed presence, smoking her hand-rolled cigar, sitting quietly in her backyard among the banana tree fronds! It was such an honor, not only to participate as a choreographer, but also to share my Peace Corps experience visually and orally with the university students.

After I became a teacher, I regularly shared my Peace Corps photo album, which included trinkets and a copy of Frost's poem, "The Road Not Taken," with my elementary students in Los Angeles. In addition, I shared my story with the whole school by organizing other RPCVs to collaborate on a Peace Corps display for career week. The Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) recruits RPCVs for their bilingual skills, so there were three of us at my school in east L.A. We exhibited photos and souvenirs from each of our countries of service in the display case. The students really enjoyed learning about their teachers'







A [Training of Trainers Facilitator](#) is needed to organize a two-day literacy and library development training for school teachers, library committee members, and the local parent teacher association. The Volunteer will provide mentoring and evaluation of the training to PTA members and will be closely involved in the ongoing maintenance and organization of the library.

work in the Peace Corps.

Most recently, I have been using Internet platforms as a way to participate in the Third Goal. I wrote a blog in recognition of young, displaced workers, especially recent graduates who are having a difficult time finding work in this economy. In this post, I share how I joined the Peace Corps directly after college “and that [it] has made all the difference,” to quote Robert Frost. The blog has a free, text-to-speech (TTS) recording for the visually impaired, embedded at the end of the blog. Of all my blog postings, this one has the most listeners, as documented in the software’s catalogue library: it has been played over 200 times!

I also added a Peace Corps YouTube video to my employment web site’s job board, as well as one of the Peace Corps electronic banners, in order to assist with recruitment. The YouTube videos are something new that the Peace Corps has started. The videos could be a great way to share with others, as the visual images and audio will definitely bring back memories of your service. Perhaps you’ll find one about the country, or even the city, in which you served!

I don’t go around talking about the Peace Corps all the time. Instead, I’ve embedded it into my life, work, and artistic endeavors. As Shane Townsend (RPCV Bolivia, 2003-05) said in a previ-

ous *Hotline* article, “The pursuit of the Third Goal is much like the Peace Corps experience itself; you’ll get far more out of it than you can imagine.” In my opinion, realizing the Third Goal has been a charm for me. The Peace Corps is firmly a part of who I am even now, twenty-three years after my service.
