Are you looking for something to do while waiting for prospective employers to respond to you? Do you find yourself constantly talking about your Peace Corps experiences to family and friends as they become less and less captivated? Doing Third Goal activities can be a great solution for both dilemmas. In addition to doing presentations with school groups, I encourage you to seek out less traditional audiences and methods of “Third Goal-ing.”

Here are some ideas to help spark your creative spirit:

- Host an international potluck meal
- Write/perform a play about your Peace Corps experience

- Start a community sports club which plays traditional sports from various countries
- Perform or play recordings of traditional music from your country of service for friends and family
- Write a story about a particularly moving experience that highlights an aspect of your host country’s culture and submit it to the Peace Corps Digital Library

As one of Peace Corps’ resident Third Goal activists, I’m constantly exploring distinctive ways to share world cultures with Americans. This is why I jumped at the recent opportunity to lead a discussion with a very unique senior cit-

izen group.

“Senior Center Without Walls” is a community outreach program, based in California and run by the nonprofit Episcopal Senior Communities, which hosts a huge range of weekly classes and groups. Participants can discuss current events, brush up on their writing skills, learn about foreign cultures, exchange stories about their pets, chat with fellow members of the LGBT community, show off their talents during an open mic or, of course, play Bingo. Perhaps the most distinctive aspect is that these groups’ members never step foot in the same room. Each session occurs via a conference call connecting senior citizens across Califor-



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

"These people are mostly shut-ins, some of them have chronic illnesses, and they can't go anywhere without public transportation. So, this is a wonderful opportunity for them to connect with others and learn new things at the same time," says Rich Gerston, one of over 20 facilitators who make these sessions possible.

I had the pleasure of working with Rich to prepare a short presentation about indigenous cultures in Guatemala and my experiences there as a Peace Corps

Volunteer. I was delighted by the variety of questions people came up with: food, building construction, earthquakes, literacy rate, religion, and newspapers were just a few of the topics on their minds. It was such a great experience to be able to reach this group of bright, responsive senior citizens who continue to be very interested about the world, but now have trouble exploring it themselves.
