As many of you know, June is designated as Lesbian/gay/bisexual/transgender (LGBT) Pride Month in the United States. We here at Peace Corps headquarters would like to take a moment to thank all current and former LGBT Peace Corps Volunteers for their service. Working as a Peace Corps Volunteer is a challenging task, filled with communication issues, cultural misunderstandings, and general frustrations that accompany volunteering abroad. As all of the staff members in my office are RPCVs, we can all remember how difficult it was adjusting and integrating into our communities; many Volunteers' sexual orientation adds an extra layer to these adjustments and challenges. In many developing countries, homosexuality is frowned upon at best, and illegal at worst, so those

who are open about their sexuality may be greeted with hostility and, at times, even brutality.

The achievements and contributions of LGBT Peace Corps Volunteers are not overlooked by Peace Corps staff. In fact, on June 1, Peace Corps Director Aaron Williams designated June as LGBT Pride Month at Peace Corps with the theme being "Pride Links Us Together." As Director Williams said, "Peace Corps' mission strives to promote a better understanding of Americans and our multicultural society in the countries where our Volunteers serve through cross-cultural understanding. On December 6, 2011, President Obama asked all federal agencies to work to advance the human rights of LGBT persons globally. Through daily actions in the field, peer support networks, and work-

shops to educate and promote dialogue, Peace Corps Volunteers and staff bring people and communities together fostering a supportive and inclusive environment where all individuals' human rights are valued and respected."

In order to commemorate LGBT Pride Month, Peace Corps staff in Washington, D.C. and across the country will be participating in various information sessions featuring LGBT returned Volunteers, parades, and festivals, including the recent Washington, D.C. Pride Parade and Pride Festival which took place during the weekend of June 9th.

As we celebrate Pride Month, let's honor and pay tribute to past, current, and future LGBT Volunteers and the amazing work that they did, do, and will continue to do. Thank you for your service!
