Peace Corps Response Volunteers Paving the Way for Re-entry to Guinea

Over the past 15 years, Peace Corps Response has played an increasingly significant role in meeting the demand for highly skilled Volunteers. Since 1996, the program has recruited and placed over 1,500 seasoned professionals on short-term, high-impact assignments in more than 50 countries.

Because Response Volunteers are expected to accomplish concrete deliverables in a condensed period of time—most assignments average six months in duration—selected applicants already possess the necessary language, technical, and cross-cultural skills needed to excel in their assignments. Thus, they are able to complement and expand the work that is being performed by two-year Volunteers in programs such as public health, education, small business development, and other critical sector areas.

Response Volunteers undertake specialized leadership positions in their communi-

ties such as [University TEFL Teacher Trainers](#), [Agroforestry Technicians](#), and [Microfinance Training Consultants](#), among others. Many Response Volunteers hold advanced degrees and come with significant professional experience in their fields. These Volunteers are in high demand by partner organizations resulting in a near quadrupling in requests over the past two years.

In addition to meeting the demands from posts for scarce skills, Response Volunteers are increasingly being used as a way to lay the foundation for Peace Corps Volunteers in new country entries or re-entries following an extended absence. With their ability to adapt to changing situations and effectively engage diverse populations, Response Volunteers are well-positioned to help grow or re-establish a Peace Corps presence in post-conflict countries, such as Guinea.

Peace Corps/Guinea was founded on outstanding staff support to Volunteers. Over

the years, the post has developed a unique bond with host communities and partner agencies. In October 2009, the Peace Corps/Guinea program was suspended due to political instability in the country. Fortunately, Guinea is now on a path to a democratic transition following presidential elections in 2010. The future of the country looks much brighter, and Peace Corps is continuing to scale up its presence in the education, business development, health, and agriculture sectors.

The evacuation of Volunteers from Guinea two years ago affected thousands of Guinean students. Due to the timing of the evacuation—just before the start of the school year—it was too late for the Ministry of Education to replace Peace Corps Volunteers with Guinean teachers. It is for this reason that Peace Corps/Guinea is focusing re-entry efforts on education, youth development, and livelihood projects.

Dear RPCVs,

Before you apply for a position where noncompetitive eligibility (NCE) is a qualification, it is important to be sure you have current NCE status. Employers who are only looking for NCE candidates cannot hire someone without NCE status. In order to ensure that Federal agencies continue to promote this hiring mechanism, we ask you to not apply for NCE positions if you do not have current NCE.

About Your Noncompetitive Eligibility (NCE):

- RPCVs are awarded one year of noncompetitive eligibility that begins the day after their COS date. It can only be extended by the hiring agency (not Peace Corps) if an RPCV is in graduate school full-time, enters the military, or engages in another activity that the hiring agency thinks warrants an extension. NCE can be extended for two years beyond the initial one-year period, for a grand total of three years. Three years after the COS date, your NCE is no longer valid, regardless of your circumstances.
- RPCVs who have completed less than one year of service (including training time) will not receive NCE. However, the Country Director may issue certification to a Volunteer who has satisfactorily served for twelve consecutive months, including training, and whose termination is determined to be for reasons beyond the Volunteer's control. If you are not sure if you have NCE, please check the last paragraph of your Description of Service.
- Peace Corps staff members who have successfully completed 36 months of continuous service without a break in service of three days earn the status of noncompetitive eligibility (NCE) in applying for other Federal positions, which they retain until three years from the date that they separate from the Peace Corps. Please see 5 CFR 315.607 for the governing authority.

answered the call to return to the field and participate as a Response Volunteer in Guinea. On her 57th birthday, Meg boarded a plane for Conakry, Guinea, to teach English at the national polytechnic university and to enhance the teaching techniques of faculty at the Institut Supérieur de Technologie (IST) de Mamou. Meg was part of a team of 12 Response Volunteers who participated in education and livelihood assignments over the past year.

"When I arrived at site, I discovered that most of the IST's professors, department heads, and administrators lacked basic information technology skills," recalls Meg. "So I developed a course in the Microsoft Office product suite for them."

Meg's project focused on developing instructional materials appropriate to the English language needs of the engineering departments. Students come from all over the continent—South Africa to Morocco—to study at the IST. In spite of the challenges facing the educational system in Guinea, Meg remarks, "I've found my students and colleagues to be extremely motivated, creative, intelligent, kind, and generous."

Peter Thomas shares this sentiment. A Response Volunteer with Population Services International (PSI), Peter came to Guinea to serve as a Social Marketing Assistant and Health Technical Consul-

tant. "I feel like I've been given a position with responsibilities that I would be hard-pressed to find within such a large organization in the states, given my level of experience. But after I arrived to my office and met my co-workers, I found I was given the opportunity to apply what I had learned on a village-level as a PCV in Niger to a larger program-level for middle Guinea."

After a brief orientation, Peter was in the field supporting PSI/Guinea's marketing plan of their health products and assisting with a communications strategy for their international donor programs. Says Peter, "I learned a lot in the short period of time I served here in Guinea. Personally and professionally, I feel I would not have had this opportunity without Peace Corps Response. I hope I have been able to make even the smallest difference here."

Now approaching the end of their year-long assignments, Peter and Meg no doubt left an indelible mark on their communities and host agencies.
