Stepping Up the Third Goal: Our Call to Serve

Aaron S. Williams was sworn in on August 24, 2009 as the eighteenth Director of the Peace Corps. Having served in the Dominican Republic from 1967 to 1970, Director Williams is the fourth returned Peace Corps Volunteer to hold this honorable position. During his confirmation hearings, Director Williams agreed with Senator Christopher Dodd and Senator Johnny Isakson that the third goal “is a vital commitment for the Peace Corps family.”

In his opening statement, Director Williams recalled, “the Peace Corps’ mission, conceived in 1961, is to promote world peace and friendship. Today, nearly 50 years later, the mission and the three goals of Peace Corps remain the same. These three goals are an invaluable guiding light to [the Peace Corps community]:

“1. Help the people of interested countries in meeting their needs for trained men and women.

“2. Help promote a better understanding of Americans

on the part of the peoples served.

“3. Help promote a better understanding of other peoples on the part of Americans.

“There are old and new challenges. Poverty, disease, famine, and illiteracy are issues that continue to challenge developing countries, and in some cases are exacerbated by current problems like climate change, government instability, and terrorism. The work of Peace Corps Volunteers is not easy, but it is substantial. Living and working in communities around the world for twenty seven months creates hope and a cross-cultural understanding that is incomparable to any other life experience.”

The work of returned Volunteers is equally vital. The third goal of the Peace Corps mission calls upon Volunteers to bring about a better understanding of the world by Americans. Director Williams stated that “Volunteers are wonderful ambassadors of humanitarian assistance and

that [Americans] need to know more about the countries where Volunteers serve.” We are in the perfect position to share the real stories of life, culture, and commonalities from our host countries. As we engage in the third goal, we help to increase awareness and knowledge of other cultures and global issues while inspiring others to make a difference, too.

You may be wondering exactly how you might engage in third goal activities. Or, if you have given a presentation in the past, you may ask what other types of activities you can do. 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tucky RPCV Association's annual winter gathering, we coordinated a children's Peace Corps story hour at four branches of the local public library. RPCVs told and read stories, talked about their Peace Corps experience, and led crafts and other activities."

Three RPCVs who served in Costa Rica, Kenya, and Turkmenistan celebrated the Peace Corps' 47th anniversary during Peace Corps Week 2008 as they hosted a local radio show in honor of the Peace Corps in Minneapolis, in St. Paul, and online. They played music from Peace Corps host countries and shared stories of culture and life from their countries of service.

An RPCV from Afghanistan shared his experience about speaking with U.S. students: "I spoke to four high school classes with about 90 students. I showed slides and spoke about my experiences in Afghanistan from 1972 to 1974, and about what's happened there since. I also spoke about the tremendous opportunity for them to also serve and have the experience of a lifetime. We finished with a snack of nuqul—sugar-coated almonds with a hint of rose water or cardamom (we had two kinds). My students were enthusiastic and very interested."

Two RPCVs celebrated the Peace Corps' 47 year commitment to promoting small-scale sustainable development projects in over 70 countries at the University of Mississippi with a panel on strategies for sustainable development. An RPCV shared insights from her service in Cameroon and the health clinic she established, which continues to serve the local community today. She was joined by another RPCV who spoke about small-scale projects in his host country of Paraguay.

From the parent of a currently serving PCV: "I am the mother of a Peace Corps Volunteer currently serving in Mali. On March 1 [Peace Corps' anniversary day], I spoke to about 120 junior high school students who have been corresponding with my daughter, Jennifer, who also attended the school. Since my husband and I had recently visited our daughter, we had lots of pictures to share with the class. I wore traditional clothing and still had some henna on my hands and feet. I also brought wood carvings, mudcloth,

drums, baskets, and other artifacts."

A third goal activity can range from direct people-to-people interaction such as presentations to youths and adults, in the form of a letter-to-the-editor, a Peace Corps photo showcase at a local public library, or an online presentation shared on any of the free video posting sites. You can keep your story light, focusing on the culture of your host country, or you can weave in specific Peace Corps projects you initiated and implemented as you navigated cultural norms.

Talk to us—we want to hear from you! It's incredibly important to register your plans for a third goal activity every year. Registrants will receive a free kit with goodies to hand out to your audience. By registering, you will also help the Peace Corps gather an official tally of the number of RPCVs fulfilling the third goal, which we report to Congress annually. Description of Work:

Sector Specialists will be sub-contractors (an initial contract of 12 months), and ultimately report to the Director of Recruitment. They shall serve as knowledge experts in the fields of environment or agriculture, and be tasked with building a pipeline of highly skilled prospects by developing strong institutional, organizational, and association relationships. Specialists will be field based, and cover defined territories across the U.S. where skilled populations in agriculture and environment exist. Specialists shall work with existing partners including Strategy Contracts, Regional Offices, and Masters International/Fellows programs to identify and recruit top technical talent, who also possess the eligibility and suitability requirements, through creative recruiting methods such as direct sourcing, networking, organizing recruiting events, and attending tradeshows and conferences. Specialists shall be required to develop a strategic plan for each respective territory which clearly outlines the key partnerships they shall pursue and an action plan for each partnership in order to identify and encourage prospects to apply. The plan shall also include how they will leverage technology to develop targeted marketing and outreach strategies, and to increase the awareness of Peace Corps Volunteer opportunities within their specified sector. Given the higher touch nature of this type of strategic recruiting, Specialists shall identify top priority prospects to target at events or through partner referrals, then actively pursue these recruits and help shepherd them from application to placement by working closely with the Regional Recruitment Offices.

Sector Specialists shall collaborate across regions to drive volunteer prospects to the appropriate Regional Recruitment Office to apply. Depending on the type and extent of the institutional relationship and events organized, Specialists shall partner with schools, as appropriate, in partnership with Recruiters from the regional offices, Strategy Contracts, and Masters International (MI)/Fellows Programs. However, the Specialists' primary focus shall be identifying untapped relationships and partners (e.g., Professional/Trade associations, Unions, NGOs, nonprofits, and Federal Agencies).

Personnel Qualifications:

The ideal candidate possesses a minimum of a bachelor's degree; Master's degree or higher is preferred. ***Environment specialists*** must have 7-10 years of experience in forestry, biology, environmental science, environmental engineering, environmental education and awareness training, natural resource preservation/management, or water resources engineering. ***Agriculture specialists*** must have 7-10 years of experience in agriculture/crop extension, food security, sustainable agriculture, agribusiness marketing, kitchen gardening, animal husbandry, organic farming, or agroforestry.
