## Places to Go and Things to Do: The Value of Peace Corps TEFL Experience

Tens of thousands of RPCVs can proudly list two years of experience in teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL) on their resumes. While it is clear that this professional skill is supremely useful to the Peace Corps, how does it fit into your career plans once you have returned to the United States?

There are a number of directions you can go with your valuable expertise in TEFL, ranging from teaching in the United States to returning overseas or even building upon your experience to move in new directions.

First, keep in mind that the United States continues to be a country not only of immigrants, but also a destination for foreign workers and students who are drawn here to participate in our society. In 2009, the U.S. Census reported 12.4% of the U.S. population to be foreign born. Moreover, at least 19.6% of people living in this country speak a language other than English at home.

According to TESOL, a global education association devoted to promoting and documenting TEFL: "Qualified ESL (English as a Second Language) teachers

are in great demand in public schools in the United States, as well as in adult education ESL programs. Areas with significant immigrant and refugee communities have a particularly high need, including California, Florida, Illinois, New York, Texas, and other urban areas, although more rural areas have increasing need as well."

Teaching English to foreign speakers in the United States typically takes three routes: Most often, you can either work with a private institution, you can teach in the public school system, or you can work for a community college.

Private language schools are many, and they may include large franchises such as Kaplan, Berlitz, and Inlingua. Working for these schools requires on-the-ground credentials, but not necessarily a TEFL certificate or degree.

There are also numerous small private schools across the country, often catering to foreign professionals or their family members. Paul Boesen, director of English Now!, a private school in the greater Washington metropolitan area, recruits regularly among RPCVs and typ-

ically has more than one RPCV on staff. He says: "The character and willingness to take risks that lead young people to commit years of their lives to the Peace Corps make RPCVs the kind of people that we love having as members of our team. No other type of individual has so consistently demonstrated the excellence in the classroom and ability to relate to our diverse population of students."

Community colleges, too, often appear among the ranks of schools that will hire instructors with experience but without a degree or certificate. Here, there is truly a wealth of possible schools at which to work. The American Association of Community Colleges reports 1,167 schools in its network, serving 12.4 million students.

Suppose, however, that you want to go a different route. Teaching ESL in American public schools usually requires rigorous and formal training, whereby you receive either a certificate or a degree. If you want to go back to school to strengthen your TEFL credentials, then the Peace Corps has a wonderful option for you: the Paul D. Coverdell Fellows Program.



# Peace Corps Response

## HIV/AIDS Mission in Malawi

*Are you passionate about building the capacity of local communities to fight HIV/AIDS? Join a team of highly skilled and dedicated Peace Corps Response Volunteers for a special mission to Malawi this fall!*

Peace Corps Response is looking for RPCVs with experience in HIV/AIDS-related programming and training to serve as [District HIV/AIDS Technical Advisors](#) for the Government of Malawi. These Response Volunteers will serve for nine months in rural districts throughout Malawi and will work to build the capacity of district assemblies to improve programming in HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment, care, and support.

The Response Volunteers will use their skills in monitoring and evaluation to assist local stakeholders in measuring the impact of interventions and tracking data of project beneficiaries. The Volunteers will also assist with proposal writing, project design, management, and reporting. In addition, Response Volunteers will be coaching the district assemblies in leadership development, partnership building, and cross-sector collaboration.

This assignment is a unique opportunity for experienced public health workers to put their HIV/AIDS-related skills and knowledge to work in an urgent development intervention. An estimated 12 percent of Malawi's population is HIV positive. The Response Volunteers chosen for this assignment will be part of the government's strategic five-year action plan to combat the disease at a grassroots level.

We are recruiting for RPCVs who have advanced degrees in public health, social sciences, or organizational development and strong project management skills to help pilot this program in Malawi. Susan Griffith, who authored the *New York Times* bestseller, *Teaching English Abroad*, has also posted highly informative articles for free on the Internet on teaching English in Latin America, the Eastern Mediterranean, Central and Eastern Europe, Western Europe, and Asia. She points out that "it has been said that 300 million people [worldwide] are learning English in the present time."

Who knows? Your grounding as a TEFL instructor could even take you in new and inspiring teaching directions. Alan Thomas, who taught English during his service in Tanzania from 1998 to 2000, now works as a science teacher, department chair, and head cross-country coach at Bishop Miege High School in Kansas. He reflects: "Kansas and Tanzania are two very different environments, each with their own challenges. Now, we are anxious about the prom or a big game, instead of harvesting crops or dealing with a fire in the field. But we are still dealing with people and their circumstances."

Wherever you go with your TEFL experience, you can be sure to remain true to your Peace Corps values; as you help students to master the world's *de facto lingua franca*, you are also serving people in need.
