The One-Stop Job Search

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It's Monday morning and you're planning to spend the rest of the week on your job search. You've decided that you'd like to attend some workshops, meet with a career counselor to work on some formal assessments of your career interests, review job listings posted around town, check out the local employment center, read career planning books at the library, identify training opportunities, and find a decent computer that you can use to write your résumé and search the Internet.

Feeling a bit overwhelmed and wondering where to begin with so many places to visit? If your answer is "Yes!," then it's time to check out America's One-Stop Career Center System. Just as the name implies, you can conveniently find employment and training services at one location—which offers both in-person and electronic services. To top it off, most of the services will cost you nothing but your time!

What is a One-Stop?

Combining job search, career, educational, and training resources from various public and private organizations, the One-Stop Career Centers are services and programs combined to meet the varied needs of job seekers and career changers with minimal paperwork. The traditional state employment services have connected with other resources, including community colleges and public libraries, to offer comprehensive and convenient services for all residents.

One-Stop Career Centers around the country vary, but in general they all offer valuable information on training and job search opportunities, including job clubs or networking groups. Some centers have staff to meet with you individually or in groups, while others offer the majority of their services via their own Web site.

Where Can I Find a One-Stop?

One-Stops can be found in even the most remote areas. Some One-Stops offer satellite offices that may be staffed by as few as one or two individuals. Others offer mobile staff and Web services to reach the most rural areas. Some shop-

ping malls even have kiosks for job seekers to connect to the Internet!

To get started, visit the Career OneStop homepage at www.servicelocator.org, where you can search for a One-Stop by city, state, or zip code. Each One-Stop has its own unique name: a quick glance at the One-Stop home page turns up names ranging from the Peninsula Job Center in Kenai, Alaska, to the Yavapai Employment and Training Network in Cottonwood, Arizona.

What Services Are Offered?

One-Stops offer services to both the job seeker and the employer. It's this unique dual service that strengthens their programs and tailors the services to the needs of their local area. If a One-Stop has staff available, they will commonly provide career counseling, formal career and interests assessments, and training in job search skills. Job search training and workshops may vary from writing resumes and conducting informational interviews to developing interviewing skills and job searching on the Internet.

Many career centers offer a well-developed career library,

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



Dear RPCVs,

Before you apply for a position where noncompetitive eligibility (NCE) is a qualification, it is important to be sure you have current NCE status. Employers who are only looking for NCE candidates cannot hire someone without NCE status. In order to ensure that Federal agencies continue to promote this hiring mechanism, we ask you to not apply for NCE positions if you do not have current NCE.

About Your Noncompetitive Eligibility (NCE):

- RPCVs are awarded one year of noncompetitive eligibility that begins the day after their COS date. It can only be extended by the hiring agency (not Peace Corps) if an RPCV is in graduate school full-time, enters the military, or engages in another activity that the hiring agency thinks warrants an extension. NCE can be extended for two years beyond the initial one-year period, for a grand total of three years. Three years after the COS date, your NCE is no longer valid, regardless of your circumstances.
- RPCVs who have completed less than one year of service (including training time) will not receive NCE. However, the Country Director may issue certification to a Volunteer who has satisfactorily served for twelve consecutive months, including training, and whose termination is determined to be for reasons beyond the volunteer's control. If you are not sure if you have NCE, please check the last paragraph of your Description of Service.
- Peace Corps staff members who have successfully completed 36 months of continuous service without a break in service of three days earn the status of noncompetitive eligibility (NCE) in applying for other Federal positions, which they retain until three years from the date that they separate from the Peace Corps. Please see 5 CFR 315.607 for the governing authority.
