


- Since 1961, nearly 72,000 Americans have served as Peace Corps Volunteers in 47 African nations. Today, Peace Corps has programs in 29 African host nations.
- The Africa programs currently account for 41 percent of all Peace Corps Volunteers serving in 77 countries worldwide. Nearly 3,300 Volunteers presently work in partnership with host government ministries, nongovernmental organizations, and local communities on sustainable development and capacity-building initiatives.
- Peace Corps Volunteers in Africa work in a wide range of areas and sectors, including:
 - Agriculture (food security, crop science, agribusiness, fisheries)
 - Education (primary, secondary, vocational, and teacher training)
 - Girl's Education and Empowerment
 - Health (maternal and early childhood, community and public, water and sanitation, systems strengthening, and health education)
 - Natural Resource Management (forestry and national parks preservation; environmental education)
 - Small Enterprise Development (from village savings and loan projects to business advising and organizational development)
- Regardless of primary job responsibility, Volunteers serving in countries impacted by HIV/AIDS will also likely be involved in support efforts related to the pandemic.



 Ghana was the first country in the world to welcome Peace Corps. The first group of Volunteers arrived in Ghana on August 30, 1961. More than 4,500 Americans have successfully served as Peace Corps Volunteers in Ghana since 1961.

As Peace Corps approaches its 50th anniversary, its service legacy continues to promote peace and friendship around the world with 7,671 volunteers serving in 77 host countries. Historically, nearly 200,000 Americans have served with the Peace Corps to promote a better understanding between Americans and the people of 139 host countries. Peace Corps Volunteers must be U.S. citizens and at least 18 years of age. Peace Corps service is a 27-month commitment.
