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The End of an Era - A New Hotline for the 21st Century By Erica Herrmann, Program Specialist



The Office of Third Goal and Returned Volunteer Services is making some exciting changes to the current format of both the *Hotline* newsletter and the RPCVNetwork listserv. We recognize that RPCVs and employers alike value the opportunity to use our *free* services to advertise and search for jobs; by improving our platform, this process will be made even easier.

Starting January 2, 2013, *Hotline* and the RPCVNetwork listserv will be merged into one modern, interactive jobs board. This new format will allow you to search for specific job requirements (e.g. Noncompetitive Eligibility or advanced degree),

location, as well as the closing date for the position. You will also have the ability to subscribe to relevant alerts when particular jobs are posted that are of interest to you. The best part of this new platform is that it will allow you to view positions in real time.

With these improvements, we want to make you aware of the important changes that will be affecting you. First, if you are signed up to receive daily email announcements from the RPCVNetwork listserv you will no longer be receiving them. When the platform is unveiled early in the New Year, you will receive detailed instructions on how to subscribe to alerts.

Secondly, job announcements and internships that were originally posted on the listserv and *Hotline* will now be combined and located in one place at www.peacecorps.gov/hotline for your convenience.

A final important change is that we will *no longer* be posting housing announcements as we did through the listserv.

This new interactive format is a giant leap forward that is sure to please both RPCVs and employers alike. Make sure you take advantage of these improved capabilities available exclusively to RPCVs on January 2, 2013!

Q: Do RPCVs have a GS rating for federal employment?

A: As a Peace Corps Volunteer, you were not a federal employee and therefore do not have a GS ranking. You can still apply to federal jobs, but you'll need to assess your qualifications and experience. 
