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## My 3rd Goal Job

My Peace Corps service has been a formative experience in my career path. I have gained a true passion and understanding of the people I served, and I have been lucky enough to utilize this in the formation of a career that directly relates to the Peace Corps Third Goal.

I was a Community Economic Development Volunteer with CHF International in Sheki and Zagatala, Azerbaijan. After finishing my service, I designed, organized, and implemented an advanced English conversation and grammar class in Almaty, Kazakhstan for an Exxon-Mobile sponsored program. In Almaty, I applied some of the pedagogical methods I learned when I was preparing students for the FLEX high school exchange in Zagatala and improved my Russian and Kazakh language skills.

Upon completing my contract in Almaty, I returned to the Caucasus as a Fulbright Fellow in Azerbaijan and Georgia where I studied the

political participation of ethnic Azeris in both countries. I was fortunate to delve deeper into Azeri society on both sides of the borders while advancing my understanding of the regional and linguistic differences amongst them. As a Kathryn Davis Fellow for Peace at Middlebury College, I continued to develop my Russian language skills while also maintaining my connection to Azerbaijan. I went on to organize activities for high-flying youth throughout the United States. Eventually, I was given the opportunity to return to Ukraine and Azerbaijan as a FLEX Program Recruiter for the American Councils for International Education; allowing me to further utilize my experience working in schools and Eastern European societies while also implementing my language skills - both of which were initiated during my Peace Corps service.

After completing the 2012 recruiting year, I returned to Washington, D.C. and started working at the Karabakh Foundation as a Cultural Pro-

grams Officer and Liaison to the Azerbaijani Community. My position with this organization, whose goal is to share the Azerbaijan culture with the people of North America, was the culmination of my Peace Corps related experiences as it naturally aligned with the objective of Peace Corps' Third Goal: helping promote a better understanding of others peoples on the part of Americans.

One of my responsibilities at the Karabakh Foundation is interviewing authors, musicians, composers and academicians connected to Azerbaijan for the Azerbaijani Radio Hour and Podcast. These interviews are usually 30-45 minutes in duration and deal with the history of the region and culture of the Caucasus. They are then broadcasted on 1140 AM, a DC Metro radio station, every Sunday at noon, podcasted at <http://feed.podcastmachine.com/podcasts/12465/mp3.rss>, as well as on iTunes; thus, allowing us to reach two different types of audiences with one

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weekly Azerbaijani cultural show.

As I have been involved with Azerbaijan since my Peace Corps service six years ago, I have read many books on Azerbaijan. Through this radio show and podcast, I am able to interview the authors who first provided me with an academic perspective of the country and learn more about their experiences writing their favorite recollections of their time in Azerbaijan and the Caucasus. Another rewarding aspect of this position is that I manage a team of interns and volunteers who write weekly articles on different aspects of Azerbaijan. This provides an opportunity for Americans to delve deeper into the nettlesome issues of Caucasus history while allowing Azerbaijani practitioners to formulate cohesive theses and develop their English language abilities.

Creating a cohort of highly developed writers is especially challenging, due to

the arcane nature of the topic, but it allows for the creation of a cogent exploration of Azerbaijani culture that is accessible to Americans. Another wonderful aspect of this position is that I can be the face of the Karabakh Foundation at lectures and events throughout the milieu of Washington D.C. Not only am I given the chance to represent the Karabakh Foundation, but I also have the opportunity to develop professionally through networking with people interested in the Former Soviet Union, Energy Security, Islam, and even Turkic and Caucasus Studies.

Through my Peace Corps experiences, I learned the nuances and culture specifics of the region and I eventually became a specialist of the Caucasus. My service in Sheki and Zagatala gave me a special vantage point where I could see, understand, and eventually practice the skills required to integrate, assimilate and comprehend the cultural logic specific to

each region of the Caucasus. Without the pre-service training language courses offered by my regional Peace Corps team, success in the field of Caucasus Studies would have been much harder to attain.

Networking has already generated invitations to be a guest lecturer to deploying diplomats and government employees about Azerbaijan and Georgia at the United States Foreign Service Institute. This honor would not have been possible without the chance to attend various lectures and events at the behest of my organization.

Finally, the chance to share balanced information about Azerbaijan, the Caucasus, and the Former Soviet Union daily at my work is a great delight. While continuing on my personal path of professional development, I can facilitate the understanding of something that I love by fulfilling the intention of the Third Goal of Peace Corps.
