Peace Corps Response

Take an RPCV to Work Day

Hundreds of wide-eyed and eager Returned Peace Corps Volunteers signed-up to participate in the semi-annual Winter 2012 RPCV Career Conference. For one week, they banded together to celebrate their service and worked on crafting their skill-sets which they demonstrated to both federal and non-federal organizations interested in hiring candidates from this diverse and talented groups of RPCVs.

Peace Corps commemorated its 51st Anniversary by launching the inaugural *Take an RPCV to Work Day* on March 1, 2012 in Washington, D.C. Over a hundred returned Volunteers participated in this event by shadowing an employee in either the corporate, federal, or non-profit sector. RPCVs were sprinkled across the nation's capital, trotting behind experienced professionals and delving

into the ever-changing job market.

This pilot program offered returned Volunteers the chance to explore potential career paths, support the Peace Corps's Third Goal efforts, and, of course, network. The participant employers spanned from world renowned consulting firms to non-profit aid organizations. Some of the federal agencies in attendance included the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, the U.S. Agency for International Development, and the U.S. Department of State.

The daylong event revealed itself as a meaningful and educational experience for both employers and RPCVs. "This experience gave me a greater amount of information about the field I want to work in and helped me to clarify my own thoughts on my future", said Brendan Moroso, a Community Development

Volunteer in Morocco(2009-2011). Brendan, who received an MA in War Studies from King's College London, was paired with program director Chuck Needleman at EnCompass, LLC. This consulting firm provides customer service training to government agencies, non-profits, and corporations, engaging in both domestic and international missions.

Needleman orchestrated the Afghanistan Pre-departure Training for USAID and brought Brendan along for a meeting of USAID hires and Foreign Service Officers who were preparing to deploy to Afghanistan. In this meeting of cultural research and history lessons, Brendan was not only exposed to the inner workings of a consulting firm, but also the tasks and responsibilities that constitute a USAID position. Because the mission of USAID is complementary to that of the Peace Corps, it is no surprise that their

agency historically attracts RPCVs. Moreover, EnCompass, LLC and USAID highly value the training and skills acquired in the Peace Corps, and actively recruit returned Volunteers. Brendan made valuable connections and plans on following-up.

For some, *Take an RPCV to Work Day* was a momentous event that offered solutions to some very arduous problems. Roy Martin has had to abruptly transition back to life in the United States and begin an unexpected job hunt after his service in Honduras ended prematurely due to increasing violence within the country. As a result, Peace Corps removed all currently serving Peace Corps Volunteers from Honduras in January 2012 followed by a safety and security assessment to determine the future of Peace Corps Honduras. The agency will announce its' decision on Peace Corps Honduras soon. Roy was left in an abeyance of uncertainty. "I didn't anticipate having to worry about the job market until May of 2013, so it's frustrating to have to rush all kinds of decisions that I thought I had so much more time to think about down in Honduras", he said.

Roy was invited to the U.S. Department of Agriculture and was able to witness the intricate structure of a federal agency. He sat through three meetings in which the managerial staff brainstormed ways to reorganize various departments throughout USDA; in the process, disclosing how bureaucracies promote efficacy and accountability. Roy is a recent graduate from Carleton College in Northfield, Minnesota, where he majored in History. After college, he imagined a career that would combine his love for public service and his insatiable desire to travel. Although he has found the Foreign Service an appealing career route, he had never before been exposed to positions within federal agencies. With this day of shadowing came an unexpected introduction to an entirely new body of federal job options. Roy was unaware that USDA

offers a pool of variegated career possibilities extending beyond the domestic market. Now, Roy is looking into the Foreign Agriculture Service and expanding his purview of career paths.

A handful of RPCVs were stationed at Peace Corps Headquarters and met with our very own Director Aaron Williams. By observing the administrative aspect of the Peace Corps and witnessing the complex process behind getting people in and out of the field, they acquired a more comprehensive understanding of the agency. "I was surprised at how informative it was", said Diana Martinez (Dominican Republic, 2007-2010). Others spent the day in the classrooms of Georgetown, fomenting the idea of graduate school and learning about international education opportunities.

Not only were RPCVs granted the chance to learn about their host organizations, but the employers also walked away with some new insight on the mission of the Peace Corps. Most returned Volunteers gave either a formal Third Goal presentation or facilitated a brief discussion about their individual Peace Corps story. Roy gave a slide show for five employees at USDA and took questions about the Peace Corps's current position in Honduras. "They thanked me for my service and I felt that they were really listening and cared", he said. Lucia Cruz (the Gambia, 2009-2011), along with five other RPCVs, gave mini-slide shows at the General Services Administration.

A common thread throughout each of these success stories is that every RPCV found meaningful ways to integrate their Peace Corps service into their larger career aspirations. The Peace Corps was a definitive experience for every Volunteer. As you pass into new periods of your lives, cultivate those sentiments you derived from the Peace Corps, and you will never fail to stand out in the job market.
