## Third Goal: Transitioning home

Returning to the United States is a major adjustment for anyone who has spent time overseas in another culture. The myriad of offerings on T.V., a heightened sense of language awareness, the array of consumer products available, and a renewed sense of First Amendment freedoms are just a few examples of the overwhelming differences. However, returning home is also a perfect opportunity to reevaluate one's life priorities and to appreciate the cultural lessons learned through one's Peace Corps experience. The third goal provides a platform for sharing these lessons, and the cultural similarities and differences, with interested parties. The very word "home" takes on a more planetary aspect: we are all part of the same race, the human race.

I spent two years teaching ethnic Kazakh and Russian students at Ablai Khan University in the 9th largest nation in the world, Kazakhstan. Upon COS, I left my adopted host family, faculty,

and students behind with deep regret. How does one say goodbye to four children of a family who included me as one of their own? What words can explain the feelings I developed for teachers and students who were a part of my life for an extended period of time in this previously unfamiliar Central Asian nation? And how do I share my newfound love for a country known to many, if not a majority of Americans, as merely "one of the Stans."

Third goal opportunities presented themselves almost immediately upon my return. My local library director overheard me speaking to someone about Kazakhstan and asked if I would create a presentation for a group of people interested in other cultures. A second opportunity came when my pastor announced the formation of a weekly series on world religions. I am a Methodist, born and bred, but my host family and village are Kazakh Muslims. My interest in studying the Koran has led to many enlightening conversa-

tions with both teachers and Kymbat, a Muslim student. On this side of the world, I have had equally revealing discussions with Americans who still know little about the everyday beliefs of an average Muslim. They ask questions on such subjects as polygamous marriages and how women adjust, the attitude Kazakh people hold toward Americans, or the differences in how world history is viewed and taught.

For me, schools are the most obvious places to share my connection with Kazakhstan. Before joining the Peace Corps, I taught Social Studies for 38 years at a southern New Jersey high school. This year, the school will host my presentations in both geography and World Cultures classes. I have and continue to use "The Flat Stanley Project," which was created by a Canadian educator who adopted Jeff Brown's book into a cultural exchange program. This project facilitates letter-writing by school children to each other as they document Flat Stanley's travels around





the globe. During service, "Flat Stanley" has allowed me to connect children in tropical Palau with the children of arid Kazakhstan, enabling a visual sharing of two very different countries. I continue to use this same project to create a link between students of sea level South Jersey and Key West and students in the steppes and mountains of Kazakhstan.

In addition sharing with students, perhaps the most important third goal activity is sharing my knowledge of Kazakhstan with individuals in commonplace situations. For example, the waitress who asked me, "Oh, is that a real country? I thought they made it up for the movie," and the bank teller who imagined Kazakhstan in central Africa, as well as others who believed Kazakhstan was still a part of the USSR. After speaking with them, these people now know there is an

independent nation in Central Asia preparing its citizens to be fluent in Kazakh, Russian, and English. I've spoken to retirees who are facing a time-drought but now understand there is a second career awaiting them somewhere in the world with potentially new mind-boggling adventures. How far are they willing to go?

Third goal activities come in many forms. These activities have helped me continue to feel connected with Kazakhstan while making this dramatic readjustment back to the U.S. They have also allowed me to share my newfound love for a country not well known to many Americans. I hope to save up enough money to return to Kazakhstan to visit my teachers, students, and host family during Nauryz (the second New Year in the spring) and return with yet another Kazakh street cat—and more stories to share.

*It's not too early to start thinking about how you'll celebrate Teacher Appreciation Week (May 3-7)! Relive your service by sharing stories about teaching and learning throughout the month of May. Continue to help to increase understanding about your host country while recognizing the teachers you had there. Talk about your language tutor, your mentor, your cultural guide, or the students and children you learned from.*
