Bringing Sustainable Solutions Home: Leveling the playing field in U.S. public schools

This article first appeared in the February 15, 2007, issue of Hotline.

During my time in Jordan as a Peace Corps Volunteer, I worked as an audiologist. I fit hearing aids and made ear moulds, submitted applications for hearing aids to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency and the Jordanian welfare system, ran a mobile outreach clinic for audiological services, and promoted deaf awareness in Palestinian refugee camps, community centers, and schools for the deaf.

When I returned to the United States in 2002, I was unsure about how my specialized experience would translate into another career. I wanted to continue to effect change after the Peace Corps, but I wasn't sure how. Then I attended an information session about Teach for America. There, I learned

that of the 13 million children growing up in poverty in the U.S., only half will graduate from high school—and those that do will perform on average at an eighth-grade level.

As I researched the organization, I found that not only did Teach for America and Peace Corps share basic operating beliefs, like the need to educate the members of a society to promote large-scale change, but that both organizations placed an emphasis on building sustainability.

So, I joined Teach for America in 2003 as a New York City corps member. Immediately I found that many of the skills I had acquired in Peace Corps made me a better teacher. I initially struggled to relate to the primarily Puerto Rican, Dominican, and African-American populations in the communities where I taught. Yet, by utilizing the com-

munication and leadership skills that I had honed and refined during my time in the Peace Corps, I worked to build relationships with the families of my students to garner their support, build trust, and ultimately help my students to achieve at higher levels than ever before. I conducted home visits, courted invitations to block parties and barbecues, and found other ways to relate to my students in a more personal way.

Drawing upon my community-member recruitment experience in Jordan also proved to be helpful in the classroom as I worked to build practical, sustainable relationships with members of the community in New York City who helped support my students in a variety of manners.

As a Peace Corps Volunteer, I gained wisdom and perspective, grew

Tips from the Certification Specialist

If you had an unconsolidated Perkins loan, your loan may have been eligible for a partial Perkins loan cancellation of 15% for each year of service for the first 2 years (and 20% for each year of service for the 3rd and 4th years). PLEASE NOTE: a year of service includes your training time for this benefit. If your lender did not count training time as part of a year of your service and therefore denied a year of the partial cancellation benefit, please email the Volunteer Certification Specialist at certifications@peacecorps.gov to obtain another Certification to resubmit to your lender and for general assistance.



personally, and received far more than I ever gave during my time of service to the people of Jordan. I hoped for the same from my Teach for America experience. And, as anticipated, I learned more from my students than I ever imagined I could.

During my second year in the classroom, after the death of someone very close to me, I returned to school uncertain about how I would deal with this tragedy while continuing to lead and inspire a class full of second-graders. As we sat in a circle for our regular community meeting, the questions regarding my absence started pouring in. I explained that death is something very sad, and permanent, and that while at times I might be feeling bad, it wasn't anyone's fault. One student raised his hand and said, "My grandfather had cancer and

he died. It was sad." In our community circle, we all agreed that yes, this was a very sad thing. Another student raised her hand and said, "Last year my grandmother was hit by a car, and she died. I cried a lot." And again, our circle agreed that this was indeed sad. Finally, Jabari raised his hand and said with somber sincerity, "I had a plant, and I forgot to water it, and it died." We all sat in silence.

In that moment, I had the opportunity to foster this child's growing knowledge of life and death and cultivate this connection to his own life experience, or to cut it off by letting the depth of my pain cause me to question the sadness of his situation. I realized that by working to understand this child's young and malleable perspective of life and death, I was broadening my own understanding. I chose

to agree that the death of Jabari's plant was, in fact, sad and I was again reminded how much of a learning process teaching can be.

In the words of President John F. Kennedy, "The logic of the Peace Corps is that someday we are going to bring it home to America." That's what I'm doing and Teach for America has given me the framework and support to do it.
