Putting Your Language Skills to Work: What to do if no one has ever heard of the language you learned in the Peace Corps

A few months ago, I was invited to a meeting about a World Bank project to improve the plight of indigenous people in Paraguay, featuring a visiting expert from Paraguay. As a Municipal Services RPCV who served in a semi-urban town in Paraguay, I had some basic familiarity with this issue, but not as much as my colleagues who have studied indigenous rights the world over.

As each of my colleagues arrived, they complimented our visiting guest, usually in Spanish, about how much they admired her recent book, or the legal rights initiative she had undertaken, or her general fortitude for spending months at a time in the harsh conditions of the Paraguayan Chaco living simply among the indigenous people. But I think that none of these compliments impressed her as much as my simple greeting of “*Mba’etekopio!*” in Guaraní, Paraguay’s indigenous language, which I learned to speak during pre-service

training. At this meeting, I was the youngest person in the room by at least 20 years, but suddenly the real experts began treating me as an equal: asking my opinion about the issue and generally taking me more seriously than they should have.

Now, I am certain that my (very rusty) Guaraní skills are not the reason I got my job in international development—if anything, it was Spanish, the other language I used in Paraguay. Still, I use my little-known indigenous language at work and in life much more than I ever expected to back when I struggled to pronounce these strange new words. Talking with other RPCVs, I’ve learned that most of them share this sentiment. The professional benefits of Peace Corps language training accrue even to those who never learned a “hot” language like Spanish, French, Chinese, or Russian.

My colleague, Linda Lee (Philippines, 2003-05), told me that she, too, did not expect to use the Tagalog

that she learned during her service. But she was surprised when she overheard Filipino colleagues speaking Tagalog in the corridors at work. “Speaking a relatively obscure language has helped me to develop an instant camaraderie with Filipinos I meet for the first time and befriend many who work at the World Bank with me,” Linda said. With more than 10 million Filipinos living overseas (more than the population of the state of Michigan), Linda and her fellow Philippines RPCVs can expect to hear Tagalog around the globe.

Sometimes the fact that there are few speakers of a given language turns out to be a significant advantage in getting a job. Andy Golda (Armenia, 2001-03) told me that he got his first job after the Peace Corps with the Urban Institute’s International Activities Center because of his skills in Armenian. The Urban Institute had contracted with USAID to implement foreign assistance projects in




Q: Do RPCVs have a GS rating for federal employment?

A: As a Peace Corps Volunteer, you were not a federal employee and therefore do not have a GS ranking. You can still apply to federal jobs, but you'll need to assess your qualifications and experience. Summer vacation is quickly approaching. What are your plans for next year? Peace Corps Response has openings for teachers starting in late summer and early fall. Here are just a few of the many education assignments currently in recruitment...

Dear RPCVs,

Before you apply for a position where noncompetitive eligibility (NCE) is a qualification, it is important to be sure you have current NCE status. Employers who are only looking for NCE candidates cannot hire someone without NCE status. In order to ensure that Federal agencies continue to promote this hiring mechanism, we ask you to not apply for NCE positions if you do not have current NCE.

About Your Noncompetitive Eligibility (NCE):

- RPCVs are awarded one year of noncompetitive eligibility that begins the day after their COS date. It can only be extended by the hiring agency (not Peace Corps) if an RPCV is in graduate school full-time, enters the military, or engages in another activity that the hiring agency thinks warrants an extension. NCE can be extended for two years beyond the initial one-year period, for a grand total of three years. Three years after the COS date, your NCE is no longer valid, regardless of your circumstances.
- RPCVs who have completed less than one year of service (including training time) will not receive NCE. However, the Country Director may issue certification to a volunteer who has satisfactorily served for twelve consecutive months, including training, and whose termination is determined to be for reasons beyond the volunteer's control. If you are not sure if you have NCE, please check the last paragraph of your Description of Service.
- Peace Corps staff members who have successfully completed 36 months of continuous service without a break in service of three days earn the status of noncompetitive eligibility (NCE) in applying for other Federal positions, which they retain until three years from the date that they separate from the Peace Corps. Please see 5 CFR 315.607 for the governing authority.

Armenia in the aftermath of a terrible earthquake, and they needed someone who could read Armenian in order to keep track of the projects' financial accounting and procurement documentation. He notes that a lot of his competitors for this job were fluent in Russian, but few would have been able to read the Armenian that was required to verify these projects' receipts and documentation.

Andy has also encountered Armenians throughout the world: in Great Britain, Ethiopia, Thailand, and Turkmenistan. "All of the people I met were very excited to speak with me," he said. "They treated me like family. It gives you this sense of comfort. Even though I might be in a strange place like Turkmenistan, the fact that I could speak Armenian put me on a different level of trust."

The experience of struggling (and conquering!) a totally new language can also inspire and help you to tackle other difficult languages - think of it as ongoing professional development. My friend and fellow Paraguay RPCV Amanda Amos (Paraguay, 2002-04) spent nearly six months in 2008 living in Egypt taking Arabic classes. Her suc-

cess in learning Guaraní inspired her to study Arabic in the break between her previous job as a Spanish teacher and her upcoming years at graduate school. According to Amanda, "Realizing that I was capable of becoming proficient in a non-traditional language gave me the confidence I needed to tackle Arabic over the past few months." (As an aside, I bet you can count on one hand all the people in this world who speak English, Spanish, Guaraní, and Arabic!)

Amanda also notes that her Spanish skills have benefited her in more ways than simply giving her the foundation to be a great Spanish teacher. "Knowing Spanish was useful to me in my everyday life living in Florida," she said. "It helped me form bonds with the Mexican migrant community, which led to three rewarding years working as an advocate for families."

So don't distress if you feel like you've learned a "useless" language during your Peace Corps service. There is no such thing! You may be surprised at how often you encounter fellow speakers of the language—and the fewer speakers there are, the tighter and faster the bond among these speakers. And maybe

your proficiency in an uncommon language will turn out be a blessing, when an employer seeks you out because the language is so... *uncommon*. Or maybe, like Amanda, you can use what you've learned about how to learn a language to help you pick up a brand new one.

At the very least, an unusual language will help you stick out from the crowd if you put it on your résumé. I remember helping my first employer hire a consultant for a special project, and seeing the résumé of a woman who listed "Tongan" among her languages spoken, and "spear-fishing" among her personal interests. This was no native islander, however—her last name was Kennedy! (And, in case you're wondering—no, she wasn't one of *those* Kennedys.) We decided we had to interview this strange-seeming woman, if only to find out more about her spear-fishing days. Well, we interviewed her, she impressed everyone she spoke with, and we hired her immediately. I realize now that what seemed so strange in Ms. Kennedy's application was actually typical, for no one but an RPCV could compile such a gloriously weird, strangely compelling list of accomplishments.
