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Peace Corps Announces Noncompetitive Employment Program for RPCVs

Peace Corps has recently announced a new application process for RPCVs with Noncompetitive Eligibility (NCE) interested in employment in Peace Corps staff positions. Executive Order 11103 grants RPCVs the ability to be considered for federal positions without going through the full competitive hiring process. Each agency manages this noncompetitive hiring authority in different ways, and Peace Corps is excited to debut its application process for recent RPCVs.

Eligible candidates can add their applications and resumes to a pool of candidates who will then be considered for a variety of staff positions at Peace Corps. When vacancies occur, managers and supervisors at the Peace Corps will be able to request RPCV applications from this pool before opening their positions to the general public.

Here's how it works: The link to the RPCV Employment Program is on the Peace Corps website at www.peacecorps.gov/rpcv (the blue box on the right hand side). The link takes you to the Vacancy

Summary. After reviewing the notes and eligibility requirements, you can either log in or create a new account. Once logged in, you can complete an employment profile, choose locations and job categories, and verify eligibility for noncompetitive hire (be sure to attach your DOS). After completing and certifying your application, you're in! If managers request a list for a location and job category you've chosen, your application will be forwarded and you may be contacted for an interview or for more information.

There is no guarantee that you will be selected or get an interview through this process, but this is a great way to get your resume in front of hiring managers. Here are some frequently asked questions and answers about this new opportunity:

Q1: Who is eligible for a non-competitive appointment?

A1: A returned Peace Corps Volunteer (RPCV) is eligible for noncompetitive appointment for one year upon completion of qualifying Peace Corps volunteer service. This

year may be extended to not more than three years for military service, full-time studies at an accredited institution of higher learning, or other activities which, in the view of the Peace Corps, warrants an extension. Qualifying volunteer service means satisfactory completion of a full term of service or satisfactory completion of at least twelve months, including training, when termination is determined to be for reasons beyond the Volunteer's control.

Q2: Who is eligible to apply for the RPCV Noncompetitive Eligibility (NCE) announcement?

A2: In addition to those eligible for appointment (either within the first year home or requesting an extension), volunteers may apply if they are within 60 days of completing their qualifying volunteer service. In no case will their close of service date be advanced if selected before completion of service.

Q3: What kinds of activities count as an extension?

A3: Military service or pursuit





The following duties and responsibilities will be expected of the Volunteers: Teach math to junior and senior high school students; design, review, and revise the curriculum; prepare standard lesson plans and other teaching materials; create standards of student evaluation.

Peace Corps Response Volunteers are being requested to work as **Parent Teacher Association (PTA) Organizers**. Liberia underwent a period of 14 years of brutal conflict which devastated the country's infrastructure resulting in widespread poverty, complete lack of--or extremely limited--agricultural production, and breakdown of family and community coping mechanisms.

of studies at an accredited institution of higher learning will extend the eligibility for noncompetitive appointment up to total of three years. Service with AmeriCorps or Peace Corps Response will also extend an RPCV's eligibility for the length of the volunteer service. Peace Corps will review and approve requests for extension for other reasons on a case-by-case basis.

Q4: Does the appointment have to be effective before the end of the 12 months (or approved extension)?

A4: The candidate must be SELECTED before his or her eligibility expires. The Office of Human Resource Management (HRM) will review the selected candidate's eligibility date and the date of the selection memo before proceeding with a job offer.

Q5: Can I use NCE more than once with the Peace Corps?

A5: RPCV NCE may only be used for selection for an initial appointment with the Peace Corps. Any individual who has been appointed to a position with the Agency (either competitively or noncompetitively) is not eligible to use NCE status

for selection to another position within the Agency. For example, an RPCV appointed to a temporary position may not be selected for a 30 month appointment using the RPCV NCE. They must apply to a competitive announcement (either internal or external). Please note that you are able to use your noncompetitive eligibility again during the period of eligibility at another agency if that hiring agency permits you to do so.

Q6: How do I get documentation of my eligibility?

A6: Your Description of Service (DOS) should have a paragraph at the bottom detailing the NCE and the end date of the volunteer service. A DOS signed by the Country Director is sufficient documentation of RPCV NCE. If you do not have your DOS or need additional verification, contact Volunteer and PSC Financial Services via telephone at either 800.424.8580, ext. 1770 or 202.692.1770, or via e-mail at certification@peacecorps.gov.

Q7: When completing the application, how should I document PCV service?

A7: When completing the work history portion of the application, you can

choose to add a federal position or a non-federal position. Since PCV service is not federal employment, you should choose to add a non-federal position. There you can document the time frame, duties, supervisor, etc. of your volunteer service. Please also be sure to attach your DOS to your application!
