
2. To help promote a better understanding of Americans on the part of the peoples served.

Immersive, collaborative service

- Applicants need a four-year degree or relevant work experience
- · Be humble, flexible, and ready to work

6-12 Month commitment

Short-term, high-impact service

Collaborate with community members on specialized, short-term assignments with long-lasting impact. Receive a living allowance and other support as you work to make change.

- · For U.S. citizens at least 18 years old
- · Applicants need relevant professional experience, an advanced degree, or specialized certifications
- Be culturally competent and ready to collaborate

3-6 Month virtual commitment

Engage virtually with partner organizations around the world

Donate your skills to support grassroots efforts across the globe without relocating.

- · For U.S. citizens at least 18 years old
- · Participants must have relevant skills, professional experience, and availability to donate five to 15 hours each week
