## **About the Peace Corps**

The Peace Corps is a US Government Agency established by President John F. Kennedy in 1961 to promote world peace and friendship.

The Peace Corps brings together skilled & committed American Volunteers with welcoming host communities for service opportunities in more than 60 countries.

## **Peace Corps Armenia**

In 1992, the Armenian Government invited the Peace Corps to establish a program in Armenia. Since then, more than 1,100 American Volunteers have worked alongside the Armenian people in pursuit of peace and friendship.

#### **Our Volunteers**

- Are American citizens
- Come to Armenia with two-year commitment
- Range in age from 20 to 75
- Are placed in rural and distant Armenian communities
- Live in Armenian host families
- Learn the Armenian language and culture
- Receive living allowance to live similarly to the people in Armenia





# **Our Projects**

In 2024, Peace Corps Volunteers worked with their communities on projects in English Language Development and Youth Empowerment.

### Teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL)

TEFL Volunteers teach alongside the local English teachers.

Through this partnership:

- Counterpart teachers improve their own English language skills and acquire the confidence to employ new interactive, communicative methods in the classroom.
- Students gain access to personal, professional, and academic opportunities through mastery of the English language.

#### **Youth Empowerment for Success (YES)**

YES Volunteers work with community-based civil society organizations & youth centers.

Through this partnership:

- YES Volunteers help strengthen the life skills and employability skills of youth through clubs, camps, recreational activities and mentorship programs.
- Increase youth's community engagement skills through participation and organization of service-learning community projects.
