For more than three decades, over 1,600 Peace Corps Volunteers (PCVs) have served across the country. They collaborate with Moldovan communities on locally prioritized projects in the Education, Health, and Community Economic Development

In response to Moldova's evolving needs, Peace Corps has developed a flexible and innovative service model encompassing two-year community based PCVs, Response Volunteers (shorter term, experienced specialists) and Virtual Service Participants (VSPs) providing online teaching and technical expertise from the US. During their service in Moldova, PCVs learn to speak local Romanian and Russian. They exchange ideas as communities share and appreciate their respective values and culture by living and working together. The richness of Moldova's history, culture and very special cuisine offer PCVs a unique service experience.

Moldova stands at an important moment in our long and complex history with a bright and prosperous future ahead. We continue to encourage today's youth to develop the skills, expertise and optimism they will need to be tomorrow's innovators and leaders.

Lifelong friendships across the miles and years continue to flourish as Volunteers return to the US continuing Peace Corps' mission of world peace and friendship, with Moldovans and Americans alike forever changed by their experiences here.

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### **2024 IN NUMBERS**

## **PROJECTS HIGHLIGHTS**

## **ENGLISH EDUCATION PROGRAM**





This program improves the English language proficiency of Moldovan students by helping teachers deliver effective and engaging classroom instruction. Volunteers work with teachers in primary, middle and high schools in urban and rural areas, providing support in lesson planning, teaching methodologies and English-based extracurricular activities

# 14 Volunteers co-taught with 29 teachers of English in 14 schools

- **1,100** students taught by the English Education Volunteers in a school setting.
- **70%** of them demonstrated improved English fluency by working directly with English native speakers.
- **92** teachers participated with PCVs in Communities of Practice and were introduced to student-centered teaching techniques and classroom-based assessments.
- **129** additional community members joined in local activities to encourage language acquisition.
- **26** youth clubs focused on developing conversational English, public speaking and critical thinking skills.
- **23** students successfully applied for local, national, and international educational opportunities.

## **HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAM**





This program teaches Moldovan youth in schools to develop healthier habits and share practices with their families and community members. Volunteers exclusively co-teach in Romanian with Health Education and Personal Development teachers. They engage with primary, middle and high students, also facilitating health clubs and other activities with local organizations.

# 7 Volunteers co-taught with 21 teachers of Health Education in 7 schools

- **1,112** students experienced specialized classes focusing on health and wellbeing. **440** reported incorporating healthy life skills such as personal hygiene, practicing physical activity and healthy eating habit into their daily routines and sharing them with their families and friends.
- **150** youth and adult community members participated in **10** community events related to service-learning projects such as clean up days, food-drives, and tree planting events organized with the support of Volunteers.

- **1,355** students participated in health and life skills campaigns, clubs, and day camps.
- **187** youth planned and implemented awareness days focusing on critical issues like alcohol consumption, the dangers of smoking, prevention of bullying, violence, mental health and suicide awareness.
- **47** teachers were introduced to new pedagogical models focusing on students' needs and use of classroom practices targeting all learners. Many formed support groups to exchange best practices and lessons learned.

## **COMMUNITY AND ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM**





This program strives to increase the capacity of local organizations serving communities. Volunteers partner with public libraries, NGOs, community centers and other groups committed to process improvement and enacting solutions to local issues based on community participation.

# **16** Volunteers partnered with **52** professionals in **31** organizations

- **194** community members demonstrated improved civic engagement skills.
- **153** local citizens, led by PCVs and their partners, participated in 10 volunteer activities and charity events in Moldovan villages and towns, demonstrating increased collaboration, coordination, and resource sharing with other community stakeholders at the local level.
- **89** individuals trained in personal and career development skills
- **22** partner organizations developed new project design and management techniques, learned needs assessment, planning and communication skills, resulting in greater impact and wider community involvement in projects and activities.

#### PEACE CORPS RESPONSE PROJECT



Peace Corps Response sends experienced professionals to undertake short-term, high-impact service assignments in Moldovan communities.

In 2024,13 Peace Corps Response Volunteers served in Moldova collaborating with 8 organizations and building capacity and expertise with 10 partners. Partners enhanced skills in project

conceptualization, strategic planning, fundraising/grant writing, internal management, youth programming, and technical and conversational English.

#### VIRTUAL SERVICE PILOT PROJECT



Through VSPP, US citizens donate their expertise to host country organizations focusing on identified needs and results.

In 2024, Virtual Service Pilot Participants shared their teaching prowess with 15 school administrators, meeting the goals of enhanced linguistic proficiency of 15 teachers of English, through English classes and after-hours clubs attended by over 50

students.
