

Coverdell Fellows Events Submission Criteria & Guidance

The Peace Corps posts information on Returned Peace Corps Volunteers (RPCV) events in an effort to connect RPCVs with Paul D. Coverdell Fellowship opportunities for further education. Paul D. Coverdell Fellows events are viewable by the public.

In order to submit an event to be considered for <u>Peace Corps Coverdell Fellows Events</u> listings, the submission and the event must meet the following criteria. The Peace Corps may, with or without notice, remove a listing if it is determined to be in violation of any of these posted criteria or any federal laws.

- Event must be submitted at least 10 business days before it occurs.
- Event must pertain specifically to a program that has been named a <u>Coverdell Fellows</u> <u>partnership</u>. (For example, an invitation to a general university open house will not be accepted.)
- Event description must contain a reference to the Coverdell Fellows program.
- Submissions must be free of defamatory, offensive, illegal, or derogatory content.
- Event description must be free of spelling and grammar errors.
- Event must be free of charge to attend or participate.
- Event must be open to the public.
- Event must be held in a public space.
- Events must be non-partisan in nature.
- Event must link to a publicly-accessible website with event information. An event that
 requires logging into a website to see event details, such as a Google calendar or a closed
 Facebook group, cannot be included.
